A non-verbal play, the actors are tasked with conveying Arthur and Marigold's story through physical expression, aided by props and costume pieces to suggest various ages and life events.

ABOUT THE COMPANY



SYNOPSIS

This poignant play explores the theme of loneliness and the barriers we create in human relationships. In a world where people are increasingly isolated, locked in their own thoughts and struggles, the play highlights how we fail to hear or respond to the calls of others. Although we are constantly reaching out, the noise of our own concerns drowns out the voices around us.

At the heart of the story is an elderly couple who, for 30 years, have waited for their children to return from war. Though they have heard no word from them, the couple clings to hope. Their story is narrated by a character who deeply feels the loneliness in the world and decides to bring happiness, even if just for one evening. One rainy night, two young travelers—caught in a storm after missing their train—are brought by the narrator to the old couple's home. For the first time in decades, the couple's voices are heard by others, and they seize the opportunity to bring joy to the young visitors. This brief connection brings newfound happiness and purpose to the elderly couple. However, as dawn breaks, the dream fades. The young couple departs on the next train, leaving the old couple calling out once more, unanswered. Life returns to its familiar silence, and the waiting resumes.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Sighnaghi Municipal Theater has a rich history dating back to the 18th century, with its first performance in 1873. Since then, the company has been a vital part of Georgian cultural life, reflecting important historical events through its plays. Over the years, Sighnaghi Theatre has become internationally renowned, participating in numerous festivals around the world. In addition to their participation in AITA/IATA festivals, the company has performed at events such as Latvia's Madonna Festival, Lithuania's Pictures of Pictures, Czechia's Sesanic Harvest, and festivals in Chelyabinsk, Mexico, Japan, and Turkey. They've also toured extensively in cities like Istanbul, Denizli, Riga, Jurmala, Athens, Thessaloniki, and throughout Italy and Germany, while regularly performing across Georgia.

At the LITF 2016, Sighnaghi Municipal Theater won three prestigious awards: Outstanding International Production, Outstanding Performance by a Supporting Actress, and the People's Choice Award. The theatre also participated in the inaugural LITF in 1992.

SYNOPSIS

ABOUT THE COMPANY

En Movimiento Teatro is primarily of graduates from the Faculty of Philosophy and Letters of the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM). Since 2010, they have participated in numerous cultural events, including key initiatives from the Taxco campus of the UNAM Foreign Languages Education Center (CEPE), such as the 'Ex-alumni breakfast meeting' and 'The Day of the Dead Mega-altar,' among others. They are also featured in the regular programme of dramatised lectures as part of the 'Reading Fridays' at the Humanities House of UNAM.

Internationally recognized, the troupe was chosen as the main performing group at the Patos Festival in Minas Gerais, Brazil. Their participation in global festivals includes the Liverpool International Theatre Festival (LITF) in 2014, where they performed *Shakespeare en Movimiento*, and again in 2018 with *AmandoNOs*, which was nominated for the Public's Choice Award, and where actress Amaranta Getino won Outstanding Supporting Female Actor. The troupe returned to LITF in 2022 and is now making their fourth appearance at the festival.

Currently, the troupe is part of the Community Collectives Programme with their acting workshop *Shakespeare en Escena*, and continues to engage in the Community Festivals and Interventions Programme with *Shakespeare en Movimiento*. Their dedication to theatre has earned them multiple accolades and widespread recognition both in Mexico and abroad.

SYNOPSIS

What do we truly own, and what ends up owning us? *Sweet Addiction* is a contemporary physical performance that invites the audience to interpret and reflect on these questions. This deeply personal work, developed over several years, seeks to explore the complexity of human emotions, particularly our ways of escaping reality.

In collaboration with psychologists and psychiatrists, we engaged in artistic research to uncover the underlying feelings that drive addiction. Rather than presenting different types of addictions, the focus is on the emotional experience behind them. How does the soul feel when it becomes dependent? Through a series of physical experiments, we have crafted a language of movement that expresses these otherwise intangible emotions.

While the show explores difficult themes, humor is woven throughout, allowing the audience to navigate heavy moments with ease. Sweet Addiction blends drama with physical expression, turning abstract emotions into something concrete and relatable.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Theatre Studio BELOE is a multicultural amateur theatre group based in Geneva, renowned for its innovative performances and commitment to fostering artistic expression.

As the only physical amateur theatre formation in Switzerland, they have participated in numerous international festivals, including in the USA, Austria, Georgia, Spain, and Tunis in 2022. In 2023, they earned 1st place at the Athens Theatre Festival for their performance *White on Black*.

Theatre BELOE's mission is to create thought-provoking and transformative performances that push the boundaries of traditional theatre by integrating global cultural and theatrical trends. Their work focuses on uncovering the inner creative potential in adults, encouraging them to express emotions freely and authentically. For Theatre Studio BELOE, it's vital to help individuals find a direct connection between the movements of the soul and the body.

Through their productions, they emphasize the joy of creativity and the happiness that comes from communication, offering a space where participants can discover and develop their unique talents.

SYNOPSIS

Set roughly 100 years in the future, Dull Spaces follows Darnon, a veteran astronaut from Tennessee, and Geary, a young Irish woman working for the EU's lunar colony, as they embark on a space voyage that proves to be both tense and transformative. Aboard the spacecraft Bonnie Davine, Geary, excited for her first trip to space, is disappointed to find that Darnon has slept through most of the journey. Their immediate clash—fueled by cultural misunderstandings, Darnon's fatigue, and his disillusionment with space travel—creates friction. However, moments of humorous banter over music and language begin to soften their interactions.

As their personalities gradually unravel, Geary opens up about her father's recent death, and Darnon starts to understand her abrasive demeanor. Just as they begin to form a fragile connection, disaster strikes when space debris hits the ship, forcing them into a crash landing on the Dark Side of the Moon. Stranded without communication and facing dwindling resources, the two must rely on each other for survival, setting the stage for an exploration of human connection, sacrifice, and the depths of resilience in the face of overwhelming odds.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Light Street Players, Brian McCole, Dan Healy, and Rebecca Schall, first crossed paths while performing for a local dinner theater in Wilmington, Delaware, USA.

Brian had written the screenplay for *Dull Space* years earlier and had hosted a few semi-staged readings. He planned to adapt the play for the Philadelphia Fringe Festival, and after previously acting alongside Dan in several productions—including *Women Are from Venus*, *Men Are from Uranus* at LITF 2016—he recruited him for the project. For the female lead, Brian had recently seen Rebecca in *Lend Me a Tenor* and knew she was the perfect fit.

Dull Space premiered at the Philadelphia Fringe Festival in 2019 to great success. After the pandemic, the trio was invited to perform at The Candlelight Theatre in Delaware, helping to kick off its new season. In 2024, the company is set to produce a film adaptation of Dull Space, further expanding the reach of this dynamic production.

SYNOPSIS

Can You Hear the Music? is a thought-provoking exploration of the human condition, told through the lives of six mice living in an attic. Each mouse harbors unique hopes, dreams, fears, and strengths, all of which are stirred by the sound of an invisible Piper's music. As the Piper plays, each mouse hears a different melody and feels compelled to follow, leaving behind Tattymouse, who is completely deaf. Is the Piper a real threat, a figment of their imaginations, or simply a half-remembered childhood story? Through its whimsical yet poignant narrative, the play invites audiences to reflect on the choices we make when confronted with the unknown.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Guilsfield ADS has been delighting audiences in Montgomeryshire, Mid Wales, for over 70 years with a wide range of performances, from full-length plays to one-act competition entries. Based in a rural village with just a school, a church, and two pubs, they enjoy strong support from the local community and nearby villages, frequently performing to full houses. Their production of *Calendar Girls* drew an impressive audience of 900 people over six nights.

Committed to high-quality entertainment, Guilsfield ADS also focuses on nurturing new talent. In recent years, three members have gone on to pursue degrees in Drama. Even during the pandemic, they remained active by embracing virtual platforms, hosting regular Zoom meetings and play readings. This led to their participation in the LITF virtual festival, 'Short Cuts', and a live performance at LITF 2022.

SYNOPSIS

Anniversaire tells the haunting story of Nawara, a young woman burdened by the painful legacy of her mother, Rahma. Years ago, Rahma, a maid, had an illicit affair with the tribe's powerful sheikh, resulting in her death and a deep animosity between the powerful and the powerless. Before she died, Rahma left a letter for Nawara, revealing that the sheikh is her father and urging her to seek revenge for her dignity.

Haunted by her mother's pain, Nawara's life takes a tragic turn when she meets and falls in love with a young man, Al-Radi. Unbeknownst to her, Al-Radi is her brother, a result of her mother's forbidden relationship with the sheikh. When the horrifying truth is uncovered, Nawara descends into madness and attempts to kill Al-Radi. In a desperate act of self-defense, Al-Radi draws his father's weapon and shoots Nawara, killing her in the same manner that destroyed their family from the start.

A powerful tale of betrayal, vengeance, and tragic fate, *Anniversaire* explores the devastating consequences of power imbalances, secrets, and the inescapable pull of family ties.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Rouicha Association for Culture and Arts, from Khemisset, Morroco, was founded in 2015 and has since become a dynamic force in the theatrical world. They have performed a range of works, including *Three Nights with Maddox* by Matej Višňik, *The Guardian* by Harold Pinter, as well as pieces by notable Arab writers such as Anaswal and Ezzoli. This vibrant company has already made its mark on both national and international stages, participating in prestigious events such as the National Festival of Professional Theatre in Morocco, Tema International Festival in Belgium, and touring in the Netherlands and Belgium. They have also showcased their talents at the National Festival for Theatre Enthusiasts in Morocco.

Based in the city of Khemisset, near Rabat in northern Morocco, Rouicha Association is rooted in a rich cultural tradition. Khemisset is known for its ancient artistic heritage, particularly the Ahidos dance, intricate carpets, and traditional handicrafts. As the capital of Zemmour, the city boasts a proud history in theatre, poetry, and music, which continues to inspire the company's artistic endeavors.

A Brief Guide to the Guild of Drama Adjudicators' Marking Scheme

- ★ Stage Presentation 15% This refers to design aspects including costume, makeup, props and technical aspects, including setting, lighting, sound, technical effects, that are utilized in support of a performance along with stage management and any work that is manifest on stage but is not defined by Direction or Acting.
- ★ Direction 35% A director's role is related to the realization of a printed text onto a stage space and into an engaging performance. For the purposes of assessment, it is assumed that any drama performance reflects the decision making of a director (or joint directors), including a sense that characterizations have been built within an ensemble approach, the organization of actors around the performance space, the integration of design, technical and acting aspects into an organized whole and the shaping of the performance piece through appropriate pacing of movement and voices.
- ★ Acting 40% The aspects under consideration by the adjudicator are the actors' characterization ability (voice, movement, facial expression, gestures, gait, posture), their support for other actors manifest in moments of effective interactions on stage and their engagement with the audience through, for example, audibility, positioning on stage and general confidence.
- ★ Dramatic Achievement 10% This aspect of the marking recognizes the overall effect of the performance on the Adjudicator and, while this can often reinforce the standard the other marking has recognized, it can also offer some corrective to a performance with a relatively weaker mark in one of the other areas, when overall the effect was considered by the adjudicator to be more worthy.

SYNOPSIS

Symbiosis delves into the complex and unsettling relationship between a mother and daughter, revealing a darker, often hidden side of motherhood. SYNOPSIS

The Zoo Story explores themes of isolation, loneliness, poor communication, discrimination, and social inequality in an increasingly dehumanized, materialistic world. The play follows a chance encounter between two men in Central Park: Peter, a conventional, middle-class man, and Jerry, an isolated, troubled individual from a lower social class. What begins as a casual conversation in the zoo garden soon intensifies as both men reveal their stories, highlighting the growing divide between their lives. Through light comedy, the tension between them escalates, exposing the inevitable consequences of class conflict, leading to an unexpected and transformative climax for both men.

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Based on Alexandria, **East Voice for Arts**, is known for its experimental approach, setting it apart from others in the region. The company aims to reflect the struggles and concerns within Eastern societies, exploring how their generation copes with these challenges. The members are seasoned professionals who have participated as actors, directors, and volunteers in numerous international festivals and events. They are also actively involved in contemporary dance and theatre workshops, enhancing their creative repertoire.




